An Introduction to Yizkor

Yizkor is a very special service where we remember. We remember our love for those who are no longer with us. We remember the people who gave us life, gave us hope, gave us inspiration. This service is the way we take the simple act of memory and make it into a holy act. It is not remembering, it is Yizkor. It is a promise to the future that we will not forget - we will never forget. It is a promise to our loved ones that we will uphold and continue the sacred values that they championed during their lifetime and instilled those values within our bones, in our hands, and on the tip of our tongues. Yizkor is the promise we make to ourselves that what we no longer have in body won't be lost. We will remember how they made us feel, how they held us, lifted us up, and sent us forward to achieve our dreams. We remember that their dreams are now our dreams, their love is now our love. And to fulfill the hard work of Yizkor means that we will live our dreams and we will share our love with a new generation. In this way we continue a chain of continuity, l'dor v'dor, that is more than just genetics. We continue a chain of holiness which passes from their heart to ours and then to a new generation of Jews who will dream a new dream and share a new love. It's not remembering, it's Yizkor, which takes memory and makes it holy.

A MENDED HEART

Persistent failures darken many lives. We try to correct them, but alas our heart restrains us. This all too human condition may be in our minds during Yom Kippur, the day dedicated to confession of sins and the vow to do teshuvah, to repent. We promise ourselves that we will do better, but after the shofar is sounded and we return to our homes and our daily routines, the persistent failure, like a stubborn grease spot on our clothes, just reappears.

In this, we are not alone. Levi Yitzchak also struggled with persistent failures. Every night before bed, he engaged in this soliloquy: "Levi Yitzchak: I have reviewed your behavior today and you have sinned." "Yes, I know, and I will not do it again." "This is what you promised last night. The night before that. Many nights before that. Why will this night be any different?" "Yes," he would reply, "I have failed many times, but tonight, I really mean it."

The Psalmist assures us that "weeping may tarry for the night, but joy comes in the morning." (Psalms 30:5).

Is it possible if before going to bed, or at some quiet moment during the day, we engaged in this ritual of speaking candidly to ourselves about a recent outbreak of anger and promised to be more restrained in the future, that our behavior would be different? Is it possible that, one morning, when confronted with some frustration or disappointment, and as our blood began to boil, we might suddenly remember that conversation with ourself, and we might restrain ourselves and remain calm? And if we were able to do this a second time and a third, might this be the beginning of "mending" a stubborn heart?

When our lives are shrouded in darkness, may our teshuvah will help transition us into a blessed morning, brightened by the hoped-for a mended heart.

It's a daunting, if not virtually impossible, task. Hopefully, we can find strength and encouragement in this sage observation, that while we may not complete the task, we are, nonetheless, not free to desist from it.

THE HISTORY OF THE HOLOCAUST TORAH FROM OZORKOW

The Holocaust Torah was donated and dedicated by Rubin and Lola Lansky (z'l) on August 14, 1977, in honor of Tobias Drajhorn and in memory of the community of Ozorkow, Poland. Rubin and Lola were both Holocaust survivors, Lola from the big city of Lodz and Rubin from Ozorkow.

In 1975, during their first trip back to Poland in thirty years, they decided to return to Rubin's hometown. When they arrived in Ozorkow, once an industrial town whose Jewish population on the eve of the Holocaust numbered about 5,000 (33 percent of the total population), they immediately inquired about the Jews still living in the city. They were directed to one man, Tobias Drajhorn, the only remaining Jew in the Ozorkow community.

During the Nazi atrocities, when 2,000 Jews from Ozorkow were sent to the Chelmno death camp and 800 of the able-bodied to Lodz ghetto, Drajhorn and his uncle, Israel Frydman, secured their congregation's Torah and hid it in the attic of the shitbl (small house of prayer). As the Nazis carried out their heinous reign, they destroyed all synagogues and Temples, beginning with the burning of Torahs.

Drajhorn, whose uncle had not survived in the Holocaust, returned to the shtibl at 27 Hanke Street alone after the war and miraculously found the Torah still there. For thirty years, he kept it in a special room in his home, the same house he had lived in before the war.

When the Lanskys visited, Drajhorn ushered them into the room and showed them the Torah. He also took them to the site of the Jewish ghetto and to the Jewish cemetery in Ozorkow where he himself had collected and piled, next to the graves of the holy men (tzadikim), all of the gravestones that the Nazis had used to line the streets. He and his wife recruited Polish school children to plant pine tree saplings throughout the cemetery.

Drajhorn, now up in years and in failing health, desired to see the Torah put to use and offered it to the Lanskys for their synagogue. With Poland under Communist rule and no permit to transport the Torah, the Lanskys were afraid, at the time, to accept the Torah.

In August of 1975, when the Lansky's returned to Atlanta, Rabbi Harry Epstein of Ahavath Achim Synagogue sent a letter to Drajhorn requesting he donate the Torah to the synagogue. The letter was then used by Drajhorn to receive a special permit from Warsaw.

In the summer of 1976, the Lanskys received a letter from Drajhorn in which he said that the Polish government had sent him a telegram from Lodz notifying him that the Torah could be picked up but that he needed another permit from the Historical Society to show that the Torah was not being used for profit.

Meanwhile, the Lanskys, unable to return to Poland at the time, contacted the Atlanta Jewish Welfare Federation which was sponsoring a mission to Poland. A letter was given to a person on the tour to get in touch with Drajhorn and bring the Torah back. When he was contacted, Drdajhorn had just received the second permit, but had only three days before the tour left to mail and process the permit.

The situation had seemed to be hopeless to the Lanskys until, a few weeks later, a package arrived in the mail. Packed between two boards and wrapped in a white cloth was the Sefer Torah and Etz Chaim.

The Torah was inspected and miraculously found to be still kosher and able to be used in the synagogue.

In October of 1976, the Lanskys received a letter from Mrs. Drajhorn. When her husband learned of the arrival of the Torah, his "last living link with the past," she recounted, "he was overcome with tears, he was so happy. He was beside himself that the Torah could be used again."

In recounting the story, Mrs. Lansky commented, that, "Now, while everyone is looking for roots, there aren't many 'roots' left in Poland."

The cover of the Torah depicts the Great Synagogue where it was used in Ozorkow, Poland. The cover was dedicated during Shabbat services on August 24, 2002 and stitched by Karen Lansky Edlin in memory of the community of Ozorkow.

The Torah was re-dedicated on January 5, 2020, after being completely restored.

Czech Torah #1339

The Torah was written in the early 19th century (1800s) by an unknown scribe for the Jewish community in Plzen, Czech Republic. At the time, there were around 1,200 Jews living in Plzen.

As the Nazis took control of Czechoslovakia in 1942, they ordered all the Jewish communities to send their books, Torahs, gold and silver finials, and other important artifacts to Prague, where they were added to the collection of the Jewish Museum. Over 1,800 Torahs were collected and stored in the basement of a synagogue in Prague.

These Torahs were rediscovered by the Czech government in 1963. They were then authenticated, checked, and moved to London by a team including art dealer Erik Estorik, philanthropist Ralph Yalbon, Rabbi Harold Reinhart, and professor Chimen Abransky. 1564 scrolls came to London and the Memorial Scrolls Trust was created to keep the history of these scrolls alive and loan them out to Jewish communities around the world.

In May of 1977 Ruth and Sol Singer z"l reached out to The Memorial Scrolls Trust requesting a scroll for our Ahavath Achim Synagogue community. Scroll #1339 arrived in Atlanta in August of 1977. The scroll was moved into the Sylvia G. Cohen Museum, where it has lived since, as it was unusable for services.

In 2022, the Ahavath Achim community decided to restore Torah #1339 to a kosher and usable state. Over the past year, 100 families have participated in the restoration process. The calligraphy in which this Torah is written is no longer actively practiced. Only a small number of soferim know this exceptional style of writing and are permitted to rewrite the letters. We are honored and proud to include Czech Torah #1339 in our rotation of scrolls being used regularly.
